Topic 1

With the transferring management and operation of Trucking for Kids operation in our area, 10-4 Magazine is now in control, and Dan Linss, editor of 10-4 Magazine, is our new contact. The Irwindale Speedway has made changes to the operation, with which we must all comply. Previous free passes and free booth space are no longer an option. Trucks will be required to register at the cost of \$80 for a ‘bobtail’ and \$100 for a combination – driver only. Passenger additional charge. Booth/vendor space is now minimum \$1200 but was offered to us for \$500. Since Trucking for Kids is a charity to raise funds for juvenile diabetes, it was unanimously voted for the chapter to pay for the booth/vendor space @ \$500, and up to 6 bobtail/pickups for workers in the booth.

Topic 5

The California Trucking Show exposition is held at the Ontario Convention Center. The space is normally a minimum of \$1200, which has been given to us at no charge. If the offer is granted again, we will consider a booth and discuss staffing at a later date.
