## PROJECT BURNOUT

You wander into the garage or yard one evening to get something and there it is crammed into a corner. At first it doesn't even register in your memory banks because you've seen it so many times. Then awareness gradually sets in, it's your project truck. Your pride and joy, the envy of all fellow truckers, sadly waiting for your attention. It's been days, no...weeks, months, YEARS since you've actively worked on it. This isn't how you planned it when you first brought your truck home. Your eyes glaze over as you remember how it felt back then...why just a few months of hard work there you are, majestically perched behind the steering wheel, as you slowly pull past the open mouths of fellow ATHS members in the truck show. Never had you imagined that grand vehicle as it presently sits dismantled, oxidized and stashed all over the garage in boxes and carts.

What happened? "Project Burnout." How do you know if you are suffering from "Project Burnout"? See how many of the following symptoms you have. It's too cold or hot out and you'd rather watch TV. You keep finding new projects that you would rather work on. You can't find any room in your garage for another shoe box of stuff. Someone comes to the door and wants to do you a favor by removing that old thing from your property. Your friends tease you incessantly about the condition of your truck. Your wife threatens you with divorce after tripping over that large immovable object on the floor for the umpteenth time. If you were just

grinning sheepishly, put on a straight face lest your wife asks you what you're reading.

So you have "Project Burnout," but why? At first, things were going smoothly (dismantling usually does), but then something happened. Some of the causes are hard to recognize but the more common ones are easy. See if any of these apply.

1. You ran into something beyond your ability to handle. Things like welding, big dents, warped panels, rust, blown or seized motor, painting or upholstery.

2. Unavailability of parts, Let's face it, some of these old trucks are rare



and Pep Boys just can't help. Body and trim parts can be extremely difficult to obtain.

3. Too many projects going at one time. This doesn't allow enough time on any one project to make headway. No visible progress leads to frustration.

4. Not enough money. We all know what we would do if we won the Lottery. It probably wouldn't be the same thing our wives would do with it.

5. Overwhelmed by where to start. Any one of these things plus a multitude of others can bring a project to a screeching halt.

So what can you do about it. It's all

about mental attitude. When you first got your truck nothing could stop you. You need to get remotivated. Go to truck shows and museums. Take a ride in your friends's old truck and picture yourself in your truck. Go buy something for your truck. Have your friends kick you every time your attention wanders.

Look at the cause of the burnout and determine if it is so important. Most of us don't plan on projects taking so long, but it seems to happen before you realize it. Just because you want something perfect before you proceed, it shouldn't hold up your project for very long. Sometimes it's a trade off. Step back and look at the big picture. Is it better to have the firewall looking perfect or pretty good? If the difference means the truck will be on the road a lot sooner maybe you should settle for pretty good. Ask for help from friends or fellow members. Sometimes fresh ideas will trigger a whole new approach to a problem. If you can't find the right part, can something substitute for the time being? Even if it means putting in a different

motor for awhile, just driving the truck can help. Can you make a reasonable facimile of a missing trim part. A lot of the old trucks were built in shops with tools not much better than the average work shop now days. A little imagination can go a longway. When a correct piece is found it can be put on in place of the substitute. Finish any small projects first and put all the others away and commit yourself to your truck. Don't let up until you make visible progress. Break the truck down into sub assemblies and work on one part at time until finished then move to the next sub assembly. Spread out the cost over a period of time. Do your



chrome work a little at a time. Try to find solutions any way you can.

Projects such as cars and trucks are involved and complicated. Not many people would attempt to do such a project, let alone complete it. It requires dedication, perseverance and a working knowledge of many different aspects of vehicles. It is challenging and you should be proud of yourself for doing it. But the true happiness is in completing a project. A completed project should consist of mechanics, paint, trim and upholstery. Sometimes you have to settle for "good enough" to keep the project moving along. Do the best job you can do and be proud of the results. You did it yourself. Perfection isn't important, but getting another old truck on the road and enjoying it is. There will always be more projects and each one will be better than the last.

**Parking Tips:**

Some trucking companies and government agencies impose parking regulations on their drivers. Drivers are required to use a chock block on all rigs regardless of the size or type of vehicle, braking systems, surface or slope. When parking, the driver should back into the parking area or pull in so when exiting the vehicle can pull forward. The theory is when the driver pulls up to a parking area, full view of the travel lane and parking spot can be seen. The driver has control of the situation. Backing can then be done with minimum risk. When exiting, by pulling out, the driver also has full view and control. Pulling out into a travel lane is much safer than backing into the unknown.

### ATHS - SCC EXHIBITORS/VEHICLES RULES

1. No person shall operate a vehicle under its own power on the grounds unless the owner knows that its brakes are in good working order, and that it is otherwise in safe operation condition. Vehicle operators must have a valid driver's license, and must know how to drive the vehicle and safely stop it.
2. Each vehicle shall be taken to its designated display area and remain there except when participating in an event, or is moved as required or permitted by Show Management.
3. Parked vehicles shall be secured with a chock block.
4. All vehicles, machinery, or other loads which are on trucks or trailers, must be safely fastened down.
5. Each show vehicle shall be equipped with an approved Underwriters Laboratory fire extinguisher.
6. Fuel tanks shall be capped. Any fuel leakage will be grounds for barring entry of a vehicle, or requiring its removal by towing from the display area.
7. Vehicles or attached or transported equipment motors shall not be run unless the vehicle owner, or other person authorized by the owner, is in close attendance.
8. Vehicle operators must show and operate their vehicles in a cautious and safe manner at all times.
9. Every vehicle, including trailers, should be covered by owner's liability insurance, except non operational vehicles brought in on, and not removed from, trucks or trailers.

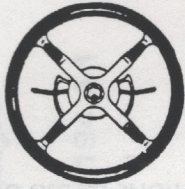
Sunday morning brunch will be served from 8:00 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. French toast, sausage, fruit and coffee. The cost is \$6.00.

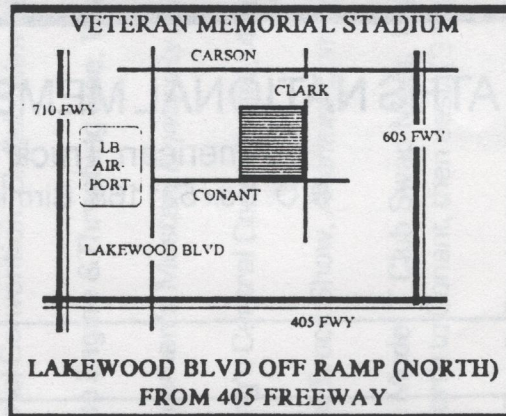
